Round 2: Beginner: You will be given one of the core verbs (pg.) that you will be asked to conjugate. For an extra point, you can put the word into a sentence. You will be provided with a small whiteboard and marker to help you for this round.

Advanced: You will be given a word that you will be asked to put into a sentence or will be given a sentence that you will be asked to translate into Dağota or English. You will be provided with a small whiteboard and marker to help you for this round.

Round 3: Beginner: You will be given a word that you will be asked to put into a sentence or will be given a sentence that you will be asked to translate into Dağota or English. You will be provided with a small whiteboard and marker to help you for this round.

Advanced: You will be given 4-7 words that you will be asked to tell a story. You will be provided with a small whiteboard and marker to help you for this round.
